



English National Ballet to deliver special *Nutcracker* inspired workshops to care homes this Christmas

This December (8 & 9), **English National Ballet** will deliver a series of three virtual workshops inspired by the classic festive ballet, *Nutcracker*, to residents at **Barchester care homes**.

The interactive '*Nutcracker* Christmas Specials' each focus on a different aspect of the ballet. The first session sees English National Ballet (ENB) Dance Artist, Laura Harvey, lead a dance workshop drawing on the magic of Christmas Eve and First Soloist, James Streeter, recount his experience of performing the role of the Mouse King. Session two focusses on the music of *Nutcracker* with ENB's Music Director Gavin Sutherland leading musicians from ENB Philharmonic in a live performance of excerpts from Tchaikovsky's glorious score. In the final workshop, residents will hear from ENB's Costume Department Manager, Gerry Tiernan, about the creation of *Nutcracker*'s beautiful costumes including a Snowflake tutu which will be worn for the session by Artist of the Company, Breanna Foad.

The sessions also include footage of ENB's *Nutcracker* performances to set the scene and live Q&As giving residents the opportunity to ask questions and find out more about this famous ballet and the people who bring it to life on stage.

Fleur Derbyshire Fox, English National Ballet's Director of Engagement said: "We are delighted to be bringing some Nutcracker magic to Barchester care homes this Christmas. We hope these unique sessions will provide an uplifting experience and connect residents with the joy of dance and live music."

Lucy Tomlinson, Life Enrichment Manager at Barchester care homes said: "Trips to the theatre aren't possible for our residents this winter so it's incredible to have English National Ballet bring Nutcracker to us instead, transporting us to another world and letting us get a unique look at all the work that happens behind the scenes."

English National Ballet is working to address the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic on older and vulnerable people this winter by extending its online dance and health programmes. As well as interactive virtual workshops in care homes, ENB's Dance for Parkinson's winter term of classes is continuing to be delivered online, as well as ENBEldersCo, our performance group for older people; and Dancing East, our East London based programme of classes for older people with limited mobility, resumes from the New Year.
