English National Ballet Announces Principal Casting for the 2023-2024 Season

English National Ballet has today announced Principal Casting for returning productions in its 2023-2024 Season, the first to be programmed by new Artistic Director, Aaron S. Watkin.

This autumn, English National Ballet tours **Akram Khan's *Giselle*** to Manchester's Palace Theatre (19-21 October) and the Bristol Hippodrome (26-28 October). Principal casting for these performances sees debuts from Junior Soloists Emily Suzuki as Giselle, Henry Dowden as Albrecht and Victor Prigent as Hilarion. Lead Principal Emma Hawes and First Artist Angela Wood debut in the role of Myrtha.

Festive family favourite, ***Nutcracker***, choreographed by Wayne Eagling, returns with performances at The Mayflower Theatre, Southampton (29 November – 02 December), and the London Coliseum (14 December – 7 January). New Lead Principal, Sangeun Lee, and Soloist, Precious Adams, make their debuts as Clara whilst the role of Nephew will be danced for the first time by First Soloist Gareth Haw, Soloist Skyler Martin, Junior Soloist Vsevolod Maievskiy and First Artist Edvinas Jakonis. Junior Soloists Victor Prigent and Noam Durand, and First Artists Miguel Angel Maidana and Eric Snyder, all perform the role of Nutcracker for the first time.

Mary Skeaping's *Giselle* returns to the London Coliseum in January 2024. Lead Principals, Sangeun Lee, Emma Hawes and Shiori Kase will make their debut in the title role. Lead Principals Aitor Arrieta and Francesco Gabriele Frola, First Soloist Gareth Haw, Soloist Fernando Carratalá Coloma and Junior Soloist Vsevolod Maievskiy, debut as Albrecht. First Soloist Junor Souza, Soloist Erik Woolhouse, Junior Soloist Henry Dowden, and First Artist Giorgio Garrett perform the role of Hilarion for the first time. Soloist Precious Adams, Junior Soloists Anna Nevzorova and Emily Suzuki and First Artist Angela Wood, debut in the role of Myrtha.

Derek Deane's spectacular ***Swan Lake in-the-round*** will be performed at the Royal Albert Hall from 12-23 June 2024. Lead Principals Sangeun Lee and Emma Hawes make their debut in the dual role of Odette/Odile whilst Lead Principals Aitor Arrieta and Francesca Gabriele Frola, First Soloist Gareth Haw and Soloist Lorenzo Trossello debut as Prince Siegfried.

Laurette Summerscales, former Principal with English National Ballet and current Principal with Bavarian State Ballet, returns as a Guest Artist for the 2023-2024 Season performing as Clara in *Nutcracker* and as Odette/Odile in *Swan Lake in-the-round*.

Principal casting for new productions, *Our Voices* (21-30 September 2023) and Johan Inger's *Carmen* (27 March – 6 April 2024) will be announced in due course.
